

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


### **The View from Here**

Amending the soil, weeding, watching the plants grow and the bounty ripen. By early fall, I'd much rather take my mosquito bitten and sunburned carcass to the farmers market and coo over someone else's tomatoes as if they were pictures of grandchildren. By fall, I'm really looking forward to next year's challenge. I can't wait for the future harvest so I can measure the growth and productivity of our garden. yet. We have more to do -- we want to bring our ELA scores up to our math achievement and push math to the next level. Those results will come. Yes, there's more work to do, but, like the great western philosopher Ferris Bueller once stated, "life moves pretty fast, if you don't stop and look around once in a while, you could miss it."

We'll ask for your continued support as we navigate tough financial times -- we don't want lack of state funding to interfere with Poynette student success. We provide opportunities for students to explore and achieve. We want to prepare them for whatever they want to do: four-year school, work force, two-year

We may measure garden success by bumper crops and filled fridges, but at school there are many ways we measure our success: from state required assessments (Forward Exam and ACT), to number of college credits earned while students are still in high school. We pay attention to many measures, great and small, to assess our effectiveness as a system. By just about every measure, we do pretty well.



We'll ask your forgiveness while we brag just a little bit. Our staff and students work incredibly hard -- it's normal and expected -- and they work with little thought of outside recognition. But I wanted to take a moment to share our graph, below, from the most recent Forward exam that was given to students in grades 3-8. As you can see, our students achieve well above the state average in math and English Language Arts (ELA). (We also compare favorably against many of our neighbors.) Like climbing a mountain, we should take a moment to turn around and admire how far we've come. But we haven't reached the peak school, apprenticeship, military, professional certificate, start their own business, etc. That is our commitment and obligation. We'll be sharing more information soon.

On a personal note, with my pending retirement on December 31, this is my last "View From Here." I'm excited for the future of our district. Dr. Pritzl is a proven leader and will push our district to the next level of achievement. The School District of Poynette

has become the 'education destination on Highway 51' and all indicators are that it will continue for quite a while. It has been an honor and a privilege to be the District Administrator since July 2012. I'm honored to serve a community that supports education, humbled to serve staff that puts students first, and privileged to support fantastic kiddos. Thank you. I can't wait to see what happens next.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to qualified electors of the School District of Poynette that a school board election will be held on April 4, 2023 to fill two (2) School Board Member offices. These offices will each serve a three-year term starting April 24, 2023. The positions are currently held by Randy Tomlinson and Sally Stewart.

An elector desiring to be a candidate for a position on the school board must file a Campaign Registration Statement (Form CF-1) and a Declaration of Candidacy (Form EL-162SD) no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 3, 2023 at the Poynette School District Office. Once filed, a declaration may not be withdrawn.

Forms can also be obtained in person from the Poynette Schools District Office, 108 N. NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that if a primary school board election is necessary said primary will be held on Tuesday, February 21, 2023.

#### **Our Strategic Planning Process & Update**

The School District of Poynette recently concluded our Vision 2020 plan which resulted in improved student achievement and upgraded facilities. As we look forward to our continued pursuit of excellence, we will constantly strive to improve our programs for every student. A Strategic Plan communicates to all stakeholders the achievement goals and the measures of progress toward those goals.

Towards the end of the Summer of 2022, the School District engaged the community in the development of a Strategic Plan that will serve as the "north star" designed to guide district decision-making through the year 2030. All District Stakeholders were invited to participate in the first round of the Strategic Planning sessions. Interested people participated in a series of sessions where they identified important issues and trends that shape our schools, families, and community. Participants worked in small groups to review current school data and then collaborated with fellow stakeholders to identify priorities for our schools.

Data from these initial meetings were organized and analyzed. A smaller subset of the stakeholders group reconvened to identify key priority areas for the Strategic Plan. This representative group participated in a series of meetings



where they reviewed responses from previous meetings and developed the priorities that will anchor the district's Strategic plan. Group members worked individually and as a part of a team to identify the issues and trends that capture the areas that should represent our focus areas.

As a result of their work, this group identified three core pillars, along with specific focus areas within each pillar (see below).

- Career, College & Life Ready Graduates
  - Rigorous & Relevant Curriculum & Instruction
  - Strong Life Skills Preparation
- Attract & Retain High Quality Staff
  - Highly Competitive Compensation Package • Staff Support
- Safe & Supportive Environment
  - Mental & Physical Safety
  - Positive School Culture
  - Community Connections

The next step in the process will be to identify specific goals focused on improving the areas identified in the Strategic Plan. The goals will be tracked with progress communicated regularly to all stakeholders. The Strategic Plan and priorities identified within the plan will serve as a guide in the district's annual planning processes as well as the allocation of district resources both now and in the future.





### **Counselor's Corner**

#### **SENIORS:**

Seniors, you should be completing applications to colleges and universities now if you haven't already done so. Remember that students can now submit an unofficial transcript and ACT score within the application. Students also have the option of including their ACT score in the application process or choosing not to include it. Please contact the counseling office if you have more questions about this. Housing applications and meal plans will be arriving in the near future. Make sure to complete and send those applications back in a timely manner to get your first choice if you plan to live on campus next year.

Hopefully, you have also completed the FAFSA (Federal Application For Student Aid). If not, you still have time to get that done. You can do this online at www.studentaid. gov. Many colleges will have priority deadlines that are in December, January or February so don't wait to get that application done. Remember, you should not have to pay anything to complete this form. Fafsa.com & fafsa.org WILL charge you to complete the FAFSA. Only access the application at www.studentaid.gov. If you have questions, or need assistance completing the application, contact the counseling office at the high school at 635-4347 ext. 404 or 448.

If your student is required to take placement testing for college next fall you will receive information on that. Testing usually takes place from January through April. If required, the college will contact your student with directions on how to take the required placement testing.

Local scholarship applications will be available to students in December and those applications will be due in the counseling office on February 15th. All scholarships that come through the counseling office will be posted in a Scholarship/Financial Aid Google classroom. All seniors have been invited to join this classroom and the students can also invite parents to that classroom. This will be a central location for scholarships and financial aid information throughout the school year.

#### **JUNIORS:**

Juniors should be thinking about exploring their college options this year. This is a great time to begin narrowing your college choices to keep your applications in check. One way to gather great information is by attending a Wisconsin Education Fair. There are both in-person and virtual events that will allow students and parents to connect with college admission representatives to get some of those college questions answered. Visit the WEF website wefs.org for more information and to register for an event.

Remember that the required ACT Test is fast approaching. All Juniors will be taking the ACT in March. All Juniors should have taken a practice ACT test in October and have those results that they can use in the Methodize program to work on improving their scores. Methodize is available through your student's Xello account.

#### FRESHMAN & JUNIORS:

Conferencing for all Freshmen and Juniors is taking place now. Contact Mr. Anderson to schedule your Junior Connections Conference or Mrs. Kirschbaum to schedule your Freshman Connections Conference. These conferences are vital for student planning for both high school and post-high school goals.

### Nurse's Report: Help keep your child healthy and flu free

FLU FACTS:

With the flu season upon us, it is important to keep our children healthy. Usually flu is spread from person to person through

coughing and sneezing. Occasionally, people get the flu from touching a germ-infested surface.

It is important to know the difference between cold and flu symptoms:

• Flu- symptoms come on quickly and include high fever, severe headache, muscle and body aches, chills, sore throat, exhaustion and dry cough. Children may also have nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.

• Cold- symptoms come on gradually and they include stuffy nose, sneezing, sore throat and hacking cough.

#### **BEST WAYS TO PREVENT THE FLU:**

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the best way to prevent your child from getting the flu is to take him/her to get a flu vaccine. Talk to your child about practicing good health habits, such as:

• Washing hands frequently with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds.

• Covering mouth and nose when sneezing or coughingpreferably into the inside of the elbow or with a tissue and disposing of the tissue immediately into the trash.

• Avoiding sharing drinks, water bottles, eating utensils and cell phones.

• Avoiding touching their eyes, nose and mouth.


You can help prevent the flu from spreading at home by disinfecting frequently touched surfaces, toys and other commonly shared items.

You also can prevent spreading illness to others by keeping your sick children home from school until they have been without fever for 24 hours. Antiviral medications are available through your physician and should be taken within 12-48 hours after the flu symptoms begin.









### **Blessings in a Backpack**

**Dear Poynette Parent/Guardian:** The Poynette School District partners with the Poynette Blessings in a Backpack program to help provide food security to school aged students. Students in this program receive a bag of non-perishable, kid-friendly food every week of the school year, usually on Fridays. The food is intended to supplement food for the weekend. Bags are dispensed in a discreet and caring manner at your child's school. The program runs throughout the school year and is open to any student within the district.
























### **Poynette Equestrian Success**




### **High Poynette Student Achievement Shines Through on Forward Exam**

With the recent release of 2021-22 Forward Exam data, we had a chance to determine how Poynette students in grades 3-8 perform in Math and ELA compared to the students in both our neighboring schools and throughout the state.

On last year's Forward Exam, Poynette Students outperformed the state average by 18.7% in Math and 9% in ELA. Our performance is impressive and indicative of our commitment to students -- and a steady recovery from the effects of the pandemic. The Forward Exam is a 'snapshot in time' and just one of many measures used to determine the readiness of our students and the effectiveness of our curriculum and instructional practices. We believe the results confirm what we already know about the high quality teaching and learning that takes place each day in the Poynette classrooms. While we aren't where we want to be -- yet -- we want to take a moment to pause and celebrate our performance. Thank you to our staff and families for what they do each and every day for our students!
