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### A Message from Matt Shappell, District Administrator

There were a few flurries falling from the sky, not even covering the sidewalk, and a high school student asked, "Are we getting out early?"

"Normal dismissal today," I replied, chuckling a bit. He rolled his eyes and gave an exaggerated "oh, man" and kept moving toward class.

I was the exact same way when I was in high school. If the weather was bad, I wanted to get out early. If for no other reason than the 5000 pound land yacht I drove to school (1975 Chrysler New Yorker with a 440 and a giant 4-barrel) didn't handle the best in the snow, or the dry for that matter.

[When I complained to my father that "something was wrong with the car" he agreed.

"Yep, there's a nut loose behind the wheel."

And there you have it.]

No matter what vehicle is being driven, weather always causes challenges to schools. When the news stations hype the next pending "Snowmageddon" kiddos get excited for a snow day, families start to plan "what if" schedules, and administrators wistfully remember those warm October days just a few short weeks ago. I am often asked what the parameters are to cancel or delay instruction. There are no official guidelines but Superintendents pay close attention to "Warnings" -- and warnings (Tornado, Wind Chill, Winter Storm) often have an impact on our day.

Freezing rain or ice can be challenging to predict as it is often localized. The same goes with drifting snow: the roads may be just fine out by the lake, while Arlington prairie battles whiteout conditions. One way to keep all this information current is through communication. We communicate with our neighbors to determine the path and intensity of storms. More than once, an early morning conversation with Sauk Prairie's Super served as a glimpse into Poynette's weather future. Of course we work with our bus company, law enforcement, and the highway department to ascertain road conditions, and their input is vital. Similar to other districts, we contract with a local professional meteorologist for a localized "micro-forecast" for our schools. In short, we try to base our decisions on data, not hype.

If the data indicates we need to cancel or delay school, we try to make that decision by 6:00 a.m. to allow families enough time to adjust their day. We send a text and/or phone call to the numbers provided to Infinite Campus and we'll share information with local television stations as well as the District's Facebook page.

We anticipate using "snow days" instead of "virtual days" whenever possible; however, in the unlikely event that there's enough warning and the district preemptively closes, we may utilize a day of remote instruction. There will be plenty of communication if that option is chosen.

All that being said, parents can keep their student home if they feel it is warranted. We ask if you do so, to please contact the school like any other absence.

Winter can be challenging, especially for young drivers. My high school ride was a rolling physics experiment where Newton's Three Laws of Motion were always on display -- even more so in the snow. I learned quickly: slow down, give much more room, and buy an ice scraper (cassette tape cases weren't designed for that windshield size). I also asked for snow tires for my birthday.

Stay warm!

### **Board of Education Meetings**

School Board Meetings are generally held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. unless otherwise noted. Members of the public have the opportunity to address members of the Board of Education for up to 3 minutes during the "Community Forum" portion of the agenda. Visitors must sign in prior to the beginning of the meeting. Those wishing to speak will be asked to state their name and address for public records. The Board will listen to all concerns, but can only address an item if it appears on the agenda as part of that agenda item. There will be no discussion of personnel or individually named students.

# **Open Enrollment for the 2022-23 School Year**

Do you wish to send your children to our district schools through open enrollment but do not reside in the School District of Poynette? Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they reside.

Out-of-district families that are interested in enrolling children into the Poynette district should **visit the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction website, Public School Open Enrollment section, at https://dpi.wi.gov/ open-enrollment** to access additional information and forms to apply for open enrollment. **The open enrollment application period to apply for the 2022-23 school year is February 7 through April 29, 2022.**

The deadline for filing a Declaration of Candidacy for individuals to appear on the ballot for the April 5, 2022 spring election has passed. However, individuals wishing to run as a write-in candidate for the school board member position may still file a Campaign Registration Statement (Form CF-1) and a Declaration of Candidacy (Form EL-162SD) no later than 12:00 p.m. on Friday, April 1, 2022 at the Poynette School District Office. Once filed, a declaration may not be withdrawn.

### **COVID-19 Communication** and Prevention Reminder

The School District of Poynette continues to monitor data and incorporate strategies to reduce the spread of COVID-19. As a reminder, please notify the school if your student is diagnosed with COVID-19 or has had contact with someone who you know was diagnosed with COV-ID-19. Please also let the school know if your student has developed symptoms that may be associated with CO-VID-19. If your student is feeling ill, or members of your household are ill and awaiting COVID-19 testing, please stay home and let the school office know. Please contact your respective school office with any questions.

#### About COVID-19

COVID-19 is an illness caused by a new coronavirus. It spreads from person to person through droplets created when we cough, sneeze, talk, sing or laugh. Most people especially young people—who get COVID-19 have mild illness, similar to having a cold or the flu. However, in others it can cause severe illness, such as pneumonia. Symptoms of COVID-19 include:

- Fever (temperature 100.4°F or higher)
- Cough
- Trouble breathing
- Chills
- Muscle/body aches
- Loss of sense of taste or smell
- Runny nose or nasal congestion
- Fatigue
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea

#### **Prevent Further Spread**

The following guidelines will help to prevent illness at our school:

- Notify the school if your child is diagnosed with COVID-19.
- Notify the school if your child had contact with someone who you know was diagnosed with COVID-19.
- Keep students home from school if they are sick and if they have any of the symptoms listed above, consider contacting your healthcare provider.
- Keep students home while waiting for household test results.
- Encourage good habits: frequent handwashing, covering coughs and sneezes, maintaining six feet of social distance, use of face coverings in public, and staying home as much as possible.

### February is National Dental Health Month!

Lifelong habits begin at home. Make dental health part of your daily routine and share these reminders with your whole family:

- Brush your teeth at least twice a day with fluoride toothpaste, especially after breakfast and before bedtime. Drinking water after eating also helps to clear your teeth of food particles.
- Floss every day. An adult should help children under the age of eight to floss. Older children should be ready to floss on their own.
- Limit the number of times you eat snacks, especially the sticky ones and long lasting ones.
- Visit a dentist twice a year for a routine check up and cleaning.
- If you participate in sports, protect your teeth by wearing a mouthguard when playing sports.
- Don't forget to change your toothbrush regularly, especially after an illness.

#### Sweet snack facts:

Eating a lot of snacks with sugar may cause cavities.

Every time you eat sugar, plaque in your mouth mixes with the sugar to make acid. The acid hurts the teeth and causes decay over time. This can be painful!

If you need assistance finding a dentist, please contact the school nurse.

What is a "healthy" diet?

#### A healthy eating plan is one that :

- Includes 5-9 servings of fruit and vegetables, whole grains and low/fat free dairy products
- Includes lean meats, poultry, fish, nuts and eggs
- Staying within your calorie needs
- Is low in saturated fats, trans fats, salt, cholesterol and added sugar
- Avoid fast food

### **PHS Counselor's Corner**

Scheduling for the 2022-2023 school year takes place during January and February. Parents will be asked to sign a course request document as part of this process. Students began the scheduling process in January and will complete it by mid to late February. Changes to course requests can still be made after this process is complete by contacting Mr. Anderson at the high school. Seniors should be reviewing Student Aid Reports and making those final decisions on which college to attend. Don't forget that any deposit refunds need to be requested in writing, in many cases before May 1st. And don't forget about any required placement testing. You should have been sent information on how to register for those tests if they are required. Local scholarship applications have been shared with Seniors and are due back to the Counseling Office by February 15th. Juniors should be trying to schedule those campus visits this semester to help narrow school choices before applications are completed next fall. There are both in-person and virtual opportunities at most schools. The ACT test is scheduled for March 8-10. All students are required to take the ACT during their Junior year.

Sophomores and Freshmen will be taking the ACT Aspire test this spring. Specific dates and times will be shared in a mailing to parents and students. In addition, all Sophomores will take the Forward Exam in the area of Social Studies. The Forward Exam testing dates and times will be shared with the Apsire information for all Sophomores.

# Spring Athletics at Poynette High School!

All athletes and one parent/guardian are required to attend at least one code of conduct meeting per school year. The Spring Code of Conduct Meeting is scheduled for Monday February 28th at 6:00 in the high school library. If you attended the fall or winter code of conduct meetings, you do not need to attend the spring meeting.

Athletes will not be allowed to participate in any practices without up to date physical information on file. Athletic fees must be paid and are not refundable. Fees can be paid via the Infinite Campus Parent Portal or at any school office. Grades 6-8 fee is \$25, and grades 9-12 fee is \$50 (per sport season per student).

# When Your Child is Absent Please Contact the Office

All families in the Poynette School District have 24 hour access in order to leave information regarding attendance. Parents can either call and leave a message on voicemail or send an email to the general attendance email address at any time. You can also mention a request for homework when you contact the office. Phone numbers and email addresses are listed below.

- The school district has a program that records student absences to help ensure the safety of our students coming to school. All student absences should be reported on the day of the absence by a parent/guardian. Please call/email the appropriate school office before 7:45 a.m. on the day of the absence.

### 4K Registration and Screening is April 8, 2022

The Poynette School District is preparing for the 4K program in the fall of the 2022-23 school year. Parents of children who will be four by September 1, 2022 are encouraged to enroll their children in the Four-Year-Old Kindergarten Program for Fall 2022.

Here are the steps that we will be using to register and screen your child if necessary. Please contact the Poynette Elementary Office to sign your child up. We will mail parents a packet of the necessary paperwork we need to enroll your child. If your child does need to be screened, school staff will contact you and schedule an appointment on April 8th or on a different day.

Here are the list of steps that we will be using:

**Step 1** - Please fill out the included registration form and the Ages and Stages Assessment contained in the packet.

**Step 2** - Drop them off or mail them to the Poynette Elementary School office in the enclosed postage-paid envelope

**Step 3** - A team at school will review the assessment and then call parents to share the results, listen to parent concerns and to discuss the next steps.

**Step 4** - Some children will be screened in person at a scheduled time on April 8 or at another time. This will be discussed with parents during step 3.

**Step 5** - You will be sent more information sheets to be filled out and returned on one of our Registration Days in July or at the office any time during the summer to complete your registration process. We will need the following forms completed from you: medical history and emergency authorization, bus information, center choice, & parent portal activation form.

The reason we would like to also see you this summer is that we will also need this information:

- Your child's birth certificate, (required by the DPI), to verify names and date of birth.
- Proof of residency (i.e. utility, phone bill, etc.)

**Step 6** - Please be patient as we close out a school year and plan for 2022- 2023. We will send out more information and class placements in late July or early August.

\*\*Note that your child must have a physical examination by his/her doctor before the first day of school in the fall. Please return the Student Immunization & Physical Examination form prior to the first day of school. <u>The Student</u> <u>Vision & Eye Health is recommended, but not required.</u>

In many cases, we may not need to have the student come in at this time. At the same time, we are here to answer any questions or concerns that you may have. Please let us know if we can help in any way. We can be reached at 635-4347 ext. 107 or at jhaus@poynette.k12.wi.us. There will be opportunities for students and parents to see the students' classrooms in the fall. Thank you for allowing us to work with your child and your family. We take our role very seriously in the life of your child. Be well!
